






Genoa as a Smart City






Participative approach: Genova Smart City project

The **Genova Smart City Association** was founded in 2010 by the Municipality of Genoa, the University of Genoa and ENEL

•The GSC Association was designed to consolidate and facilitate the process of transformation into a smart city and to engage key partners to undertake a virtuous path: research, enterprises, institutions, finance and citizens.

Today the Association has more than 80 members

This model of partnership is based on voluntary cooperation between public and private sector and act as a system carrying out innovative projects and solutions in four main areas: urban resilience, environment, energy, transportation, ICT

2016 – 32 ongoing projects, 16 evaluating phase




